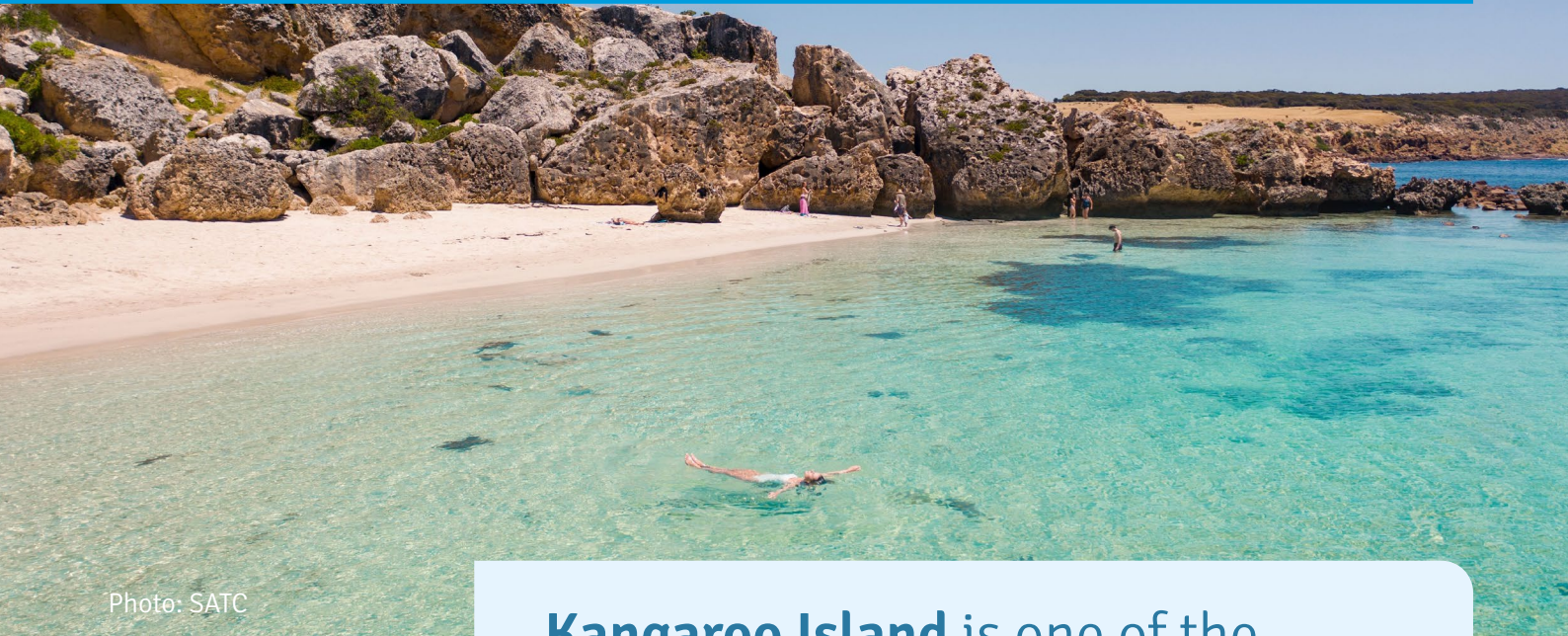

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Day 1: To Kangaroo Island

Welcome to our 5-day tour to Kangaroo Island. Together on our coach, we drive to Tailern Bend and The Bend Motorsport Park. Wait until you see the amazing reception with its array of specialty cars. With a track guide on the coach with us, we take a lap around the circuit, experiencing the excitement and visualising the roar of the crowd as we make our way around. A delicious lunch follows at the trackside hotel before continuing our journey to Cape Jervis. We board our 50-minute journey across Backstairs Passage to Penneshaw. On arrival, we continue to American River for our 4-night stay. Dinner will be within the hotel tonight to enjoy and relax.

Day 2: Zoos Without Fences

There are two major wildlife areas we have planned to visit today – Seal Bay and the Flinders Chase National Park. At the famous Seal Bay we can take a walk on the beach amongst the colony of Australian Sea Lions who live here all year round. It is an unforgettable experience to be guided by a National Parks Ranger, along the beach, within metres of the bulls, cows and pups as they rest on the beach. We then travel on the scenic south coast for our lunch at the small coastal settlement of Vivonne Bay, the Vivonne Bay Bistro. After lunch, we visit the Flinders Chase National Park, Remarkable Rocks, Cape du Couedic and Admirals Arch where, via a spectacular board walk, we can see close up a colony of New Zealand Fur Seals who live in the sea and the rocks just below us. At Rocky River we should see plenty of Cape Barren Geese and maybe a Tamar Wallaby or two. By late afternoon we make our way back to our hotel to rest up before dinner.

Day 3: Local Produce

Our first visit today is to Cliffords Honey Farm, home to Kangaroo Island's own population of Ligurian bees (the only pure strain in the world) producing 10,000 kilograms of delectable honey each year. The bees were imported in 12 hives from the Italian province of Liguria in the 1880s and remain protected from other breeds of bee by the island's isolation. Next, we arrive at the Emu Ridge Eucalyptus Distillery. Eucalyptus Oil distilling was once one of Kangaroo Islands' major industries. It began in the 1880's and was a supplementary income for the farmers clearing their land for sheep farming. In the 1930's it reached its peak with 48 stills employing over 600 people and over the eucalyptus distilling

era there were around 100 stills on the island. Enjoy a BBQ Lunch here before our visit to Kangala Kangaroo & Wildlife Rescue. Born out of the 2020 bushfires, the Wildlife Rescue Centre takes care of injured and orphaned native wildlife. However, one of their faves is how they rescued Valerie the miniature dachshund after 529 days in the wilderness. A truly amazing story. Lastly, we visit the award-winning Kangaroo Island Spirits for gin tasting before returning to our hotel.

Day 4: History, Beauty and Local Indulgence

After breakfast, we visit Kingscote, the largest town on Kangaroo Island and the first Australian free settlement. Learn of its early history and how it was abandoned after only 4 years due to lack of water and suitable timber building only to be replaced in favour of Adelaide. Next, we drive to the Emu Bay Lavender Farm, a farm gate cafe set amongst rows of Lavender. Here they make and package an extensive range of lavender products on site. The cafe is famous for its oversized lavender scones and handmade ice cream and it's here we'll indulge in our morning tea!! Our next stop is at Stokes Bay offers one of the most unique coastal experiences on Kangaroo Island, combining dramatic natural scenery with a sense of discovery, Stokes Bay is renowned for its spectacular hidden beach and tranquil rural surroundings. Located further along the northern coast is The Fig Tree KI, one of the island's most unique and memorable dining experiences. The restaurant is set beneath the sprawling branches of a magnificent, more than 120-year-old fig tree, creating an enchanting open-air dining setting where guests quite literally sit within the canopy of the tree itself. The venue is not a traditional restaurant but rather a relaxed, long-lunch experience that celebrates the natural beauty and produce of Kangaroo Island. The atmosphere is designed to encourage guests to slow down, unwind, and enjoy a leisurely meal surrounded by nature. We return back to our hotel and relax. The rest of the evening at leisure.
